

Sandra Luzzi Hogan, 69, of Tucson, AZ, passed away peacefully surrounded by loved ones, on Saturday, September 21, 2019 after a short battle with cancer. She was born on May 14, 1950 in Fort Bragg, California to John and Lena Luzzi.

Sandy graduated from Fort Bragg High School in 1968 and received her BA in English from Humboldt State University in 1972. Sandy began her working career as a stewardess for the Skunk Train in Fort Bragg which runs on historic tracks through the redwoods. One of Sandy's favorite jobs was as a stewardess for PanAm Airlines. She enjoyed this opportunity to travel the world and had many stories of the places she visited and people she met. Once back on the ground, Sandy taught English in Booneville and Miranda, California from 1973 to 1980.
